A suffix is an ending attached to a base word to change its meaning.

Example: rich = (adjective) vivid and deep in color; *Her headband was a* rich *purple*.

rich(ness) = (noun) the quality of being pleasingly deep or strong in color; *His painting*

showed the true richness of colors.

When you mark a suffix, make sure it's attached to a base word and isn't part of the base word itself.

Example: (-er) in paint(er) = suffix because it's added to the base word paint

-er in father = not a suffix because the letters fath do not spell a word in English

A prefix is a group of letters attached to the beginning of a base word to change its meaning.

Example: usual = (adjective) common, used often; *She followed her* usual *route to the park*. unusual = (adjective) uncommon, rare; She took an unusual route to the park and almost got lost.

The prefix un- means not. It gives negative or opposite force to the base word it's attached to.
